Dear Students,

The exam in Analytical Chemistry for pharmacy students will be held in electronic format through the platform Office 365 and the applications MS Teams, MS Forms. Each student must be equipped with the following: a computer (smartphones and tablets are not acceptable!) with installed camera and microphone, and network connectivity providing 5 Mbps download speed and 5 Mbps upload speed (You can check your network speed in following link: <https://fast.com/>); installed MS Teams application with access to the MS Teams browser version. When using the latter, the latest versions of Microsoft Edge or Google Chrome are recommended.

The exam for students in pharmacy will take place on **January 29, 2021 at 14.00 p.m.** When you sign in to your account, make sure that you click on “Yes” in the “Stay signed in” question box. This will prevent you from being accidentally disconnected from your profile during the exam. If you accidentally sign out from your account or reload the exam form before submitting it, you will lose all information you had previously filled in. Students must join the meeting no later than 30 min before the beginning of the exam. During the exam it is obligatory that students keep their cameras and microphones switched on! The meeting will be recorded by the exam’s supervisor and every student who breaks the silence in the “classroom” or attempts cheating, will be dismissed from the exam.

IMPORTANT!!! Once the exam is submitted, you cannot change it or submit it again. If you click “ENTER”, you will send automatically your exam, even though you may miss some questions! Students are not allowed to: have their mobile phones turned on; record the exam; hint / cheat; work in groups (same answers). The exam will be cancelled if: the camera is turned off; the student records the exam; attempts to hint / cheat; teamwork; sharing the answers with other students.

The students can use calculators (not mobile phone) and sheet of paper to write and calculate in order to find the correct answer.

The exam is a test consisting of 40 questions and calculations, total points are 75:

- Classical Analytical Chemistry – 15 MCQs, each with one correct answer accounting 1 point;
- Instrumental Methods – 15 MCQs, each with one correct answer accounting 2 points;
- Calculations (theory and practice in Analytical Chemistry) – 10, each with one correct answer accounting 3 points.

The total duration is 60 min. The test must be submitted within this time. At the end of the time the test will be closed and students that haven't submitted their answers on time will receive mark 2.

The evaluation of the electronic test shall be based on the scores obtained according to the scale shown in the table:

Score, %	Grade
≤ 60	Fail
61 - 70	Average
71 - 80	Good
81 - 90	Very good
91 - 100	Excellent

The students will be notified by the examiners when the scores are calculated and will be able to check their results by opening the shared link in MS Teams.

The final grade is formed according to the academic standard of the subject Analytical Chemistry. It is formed according to a formula, which considers the results of the colloquiums conducted during the semesters:

$$Q_{\text{Final grade}} = 0.2 \times Q_{\text{colloquiums}} + 0.8 \times Q_{\text{exam}}$$

The final assessment of the exam shall be announced in MS Teams application within three days after the exam.
