

Administrative notes about Disaster Medicine Exam In person

The Disaster Medicine Exam will be held in person during the January exam session of the academic year 2021/2022 in the auditorium complex of MU-Plovdiv in strict compliance with anti-epidemic measures (required distance and individual respiratory protection).

The Disaster Medicine Exam is two-component: a multiple choice test and a written examination.

The multiple choice test consists of 15 multiple choice (4 given options) questions. Every question has only one correct answer. Time for the test is set to 15 minutes.

The scale for grading the test is as follows:

0-7 points - Poor (2)

8-9 points - Average (3)

10-11 points - Good (4)

12-13 points - Very good (5)

14-15 points - Excellent (6)

Students who have received a grade of at least average (3) continue the exam, and students who have received a grade of poor (2) are not admitted to the next stage of the exam.

For the written part of the exam, student groups enter depending on the capacity of the auditorium strictly following the anti-epidemic measures. The examination commission divides the students into groups and a representative from each group chooses 2 (two) questions. The questions from the syllabus are divided into two separate categories that are presented to the students on a slide as numbered circles. The first category includes issues related to the organization of disaster medical support. The second category deals with the peculiarities of the medical support of different areas of damage and specific disasters.

Students are given 60 minutes to develop and present their knowledge to the chosen questions.

The examination commission, consisting of a chairman and two assistant professors, examines and evaluates the students' written works.

The grade from the exam is formed by the average grade from the current control (2 conducted colloquiums) - 20%, the grade from the final test - 30% and the grade from the written exam - 50%.

The grades obtained from the exam are entered into the examination protocols and student books.

Students have the opportunity to ask questions related to the grades obtained at the end of the exam day after completing the examination of all the groups planned for the day.

To facilitate the students preparation for the exam, students receive a syllabus with the topics they need to learn. At the end of the syllabus the obligatory and recommended literature necessary for the preparation of the Disaster medicine exam is indicated.
