

## Notice to the students in Pharmacy

Dear students,

We would like to remind you that according to the Rules and Regulations on the organization of the educational activities at the Medical University of Plovdiv, you must observe the following rules:

1. The presence of the students in seminars and colloquiums is obligatory (Rules and Regulations of the Medical University of Plovdiv, Article 94).
2. Students must catch up on the seminar they have missed during the same week. They must do so after specifying the day and hour of the seminar with their assistant professor in advance.
3. Missing more than 5 lessons due to valid reasons as well as 3 lessons without valid reasons are grounds for not verifying a semester. In such cases the student status is decided upon by the Rector on the proposal of the Dean of the corresponding faculty (Rules and Regulations of Medical University – Plovdiv, Article 96, Paragraph (3); Article 97, Paragraph (4)).
4. Given the fact that the students work in a laboratory, they are allowed to attend seminars only with their white coats put on.
5. Students are not allowed to be late for seminars.
6. Students are forbidden to use electronic devices during written examinations, colloquiums and exams.
7. Each seminar starts with a written examination on the questions for self-study included in the workbooks or given by the assistant professor in advance.
8. Sitting a colloquium with at least the required minimum is obligatory for a student to receive a signature at the end of the semester. If a student covers all colloquiums with a grade 5 or 6, they will be exempted from the MCQ stop test on the final exam. Students can re-sit one colloquium per semester.
9. In case of clear and compelling evidence of a student's cheating during colloquiums and exams, the assistant professor writes a report addressed to the Head of the department and the Dean of the corresponding faculty.
10. Students are obliged to observe the generally accepted moral and ethical norms of behavior and academic clothing.

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
