

## **Regulations for conducting an exam in Epidemiology for the specialty Pharmacy 4th year**

The exam in Epidemiology for the specialty Pharmacy will be held in person during the January exam session of the academic year 2022/2023 in the Department of Epidemiology and disaster medicine (Bratia Buxton street, 120) with observance of the anti-epidemic measures (the necessary distance and individual means to protect the respiratory tract).

The exam has two components: a written test and a written test.

The written test consists of 10 closed questions, with only one correct answer. The time to solve the test is 10 minutes.

The grading scale for the written test is as follows:

0-6 points - Poor (2)

7 points - Average (3)

8 points - Good (4)

9 points - Very good (5)

10 points - Excellent (6)

Students who received a grade of at least Average (3) continue the exam, and students who received a grade of Poor (2) are not allowed to the next stage of the exam.

A representative from the group draws 1 question from the syllabus consisting of 20 questions. Students are given 60 minutes to develop and present their knowledge in a written form on the drawn question.

The grade from the exam is formed by the average grade from the final test - 30% and the grade from the written exam – 70%.
