

Dear students,

The biology exam includes two parts – 1. WRITTEN PART (TEST) AND 2. ORAL EXAMINATION.

The first part of the biology exam is held in person in a controlled online environment in the Microsoft Office 365 (Forms) system in the Auditorium Complex on laptops provided for this purpose. This means that you must appear at a certain registration time with your student ID and use your **institutional account** received from the University to log in to the exam system. To do this, you need to know your username and password or write them down in advance on a sheet of paper so that you are prepared on the day of the exam.

The written part of the exam is a stop-test, which includes 60 closed questions from the synopsis and practical exercises, each of which has only ONE correct answer, which brings 1 point. The working time is 30 minutes. It is important to press the "Submit" button before this time has elapsed. Otherwise, your exam work cannot be accepted into the system and you automatically receive a grade of "Poor 2". When you click the "Submit" button, the test is automatically evaluated and you immediately see your result. Only students who have received at least 30 points on the stop test are allowed to sit for the ORAL EXAM. Students whose score is less than 30 points on the stop test are considered as failed at the biology exam and receive a grade "Poor 2".

Those who successfully pass the stop test sit for an oral exam, which is held according to a schedule on the same day. At the oral exam, each student draws 2 questions from the main modules of the biology syllabus and has 15 minutes to think and answer them in a short written form. A committee composed of a Chairperson and two assistant professors forms the final grade of the student on the basis of the knowledge demonstrated in the oral defense of the answers. In the formation of the final grade of the exam, the presentation at the oral exam is leading, but the consistency in the preparation of the student for practical classes during the academic year is also important.

All students who have received a grade of "Poor 2" go for a re-sit exam, which is conducted in the same model.
