## CALLING FOR PARTICIPANTS!

The USC Mann School is pleased to invite students from partner institutions to take part in the virtual 2025 International Student Winter Program.

The Mann School of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences has created an intensive and innovative group-based course that integrates expertise in drug development, clinical treatment, and regulatory science to address global health issues. Students will work in interdisciplinary and international teams as they examine the scientific, clinical and regulatory aspects of drug action. USC faculty members will lead synchronous learning modules in the core content areas, and USC students will facilitate group projects through online meetings and offline communication. Teams will present their final project at the conclusion of the program. Participants will receive a certificate of completion.

## PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS:



### Program Overview

- Choice of "deep-dive" area of focus: pharmaceutical sciences, clinical pharmacy, regulatory science
- Participants work in small interdisciplinary groups with students from different universities and countries
- Participants will receive a general session introducing each of the disciplinary areas
- Panel discussion on the future of pharmacy careers with distinguished USC alumni
- USC instructors and students work closely with each project team to facilitate their success



### Program Fee: \$250 US

- Discount rate of \$200/student if 5 or more students enroll from a partner institution
- Need-Based fee waivers available for select students
- Winter program fee includes all program/admin fees and coursework preparation and delivery by instructors
